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1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This is the Noise Management Plan (NMP) for the South West Wood Product's operations at Berth 31, Port of Barry. Operations at the site include the importation of waste timber by HGV, processing, screening and shredding and export by both HGV and ship. This NMP forms part of the environmental management control system to ensure that the operations meet the legislative requirements and operate to high environmental standards.
- 1.2 This is an evolving document which is subject to ongoing review.
- 1.3 The NMP seeks to ensure that all operations on the site are effectively managed to minimise the noise emission to the neighbouring community whilst acknowledging that the nature of the operations means that a degree of environmental noise emission is inevitable.

2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The operations involve the following:
 - Processing of waste timber. Waste timber arrives at the site in bulk (by skip or HGV)
 and are offloaded into the reception bays. There materials are sorted by machine
 and screened shredded.
 - The final processed 'product' is exported from the site by HGV and/ or ship.
- 2.2 The hours of operation are:
 - 07:00- 23:00 Monday- Sunday- importation, screening/ shredding, export via HGV and ship
 - 23:00- 07:00 Monday- Sunday. Export by ship
- 2.3 The site is located in an industrial area. The nearest residential properties to the site are located south-west of the site on Wilfred Street and Hill Street (a minimum of 230 m). In addition, outline planning consent for housing has been granted on land at the former sidings off Ffordd y Mileniwm (Vale of Glamorgan Council reference 2020/00775/OUT).



3.0 NOISE MANAGEMENT MEASURES

- 3.1 South West Wood Products Ltd will adopt best practice measures will which seek to minimise noise associated with site operations. These will include:
 - Ensuring all plant and equipment is kept well maintained;
 - Ensuring all staff are appropriately trained in the use and operation of each machine to minimise environmental noise output;
 - Adopting methods which seek to reduce noise levels, such as siting plant with bunding (which can include stockpiles of processed or unprocessed materials) or buildings between the operating plant and sensitive properties where possible;
 - Drop heights will be minimised when depositing material into bays or plant/ machinery for processing;
 - Maintenance of access roads and vehicle manoeuvring areas;
 - A site speed limit of 5 mph will be enforced;
 - Switching off plant when not in use. This includes vehicles queuing on site;
 - No use of external tannoy systems;
 - Use of non-tonal reversing alarms on main plant operated at site;
 - No empty vehicles to move off until doors firmly secured and closed;
- 3.2 All site staff will be made aware of this procedure through the induction process for new starts and through regular toolbox talks, health, safety and environment meetings/ training etc. Any staff members found to regularly disregard these procedures will be subject to disciplinary action.

4.0 COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- 4.1 All site staff will be responsible for reporting any noise problems to the site manager immediately.
- 4.2 South West Wood Products Ltd will operate a policy of responding to complaints from local residents. Any complaints associated with noise from site operations will be fully investigated and recorded by the site manager. Details of any mitigation or remedial actions



taken in response to a complaint will be recorded as per the procedures in the management system and maintenance of the site diary, see Appendix A. This will include the actions to identify the source of noise and, where necessary and feasible, any potential action to reduce the level of noise associated with the plant or take it out of service until the problem has been rectified.

4.3 This NMP will be reviewed annually by the site manager or otherwise in response to a request, changed circumstances such as the operation of new processing techniques or substantiated noise complaints.
